In December, our annual Holiday Hamper Program was bigger and better than ever, ensuring happy faces for countless children and parents during the challenging holiday season. 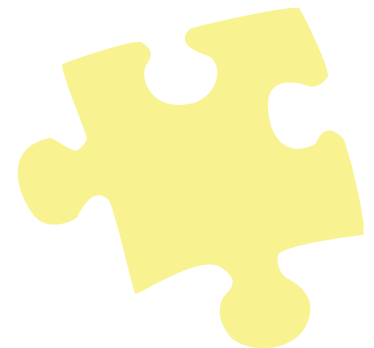

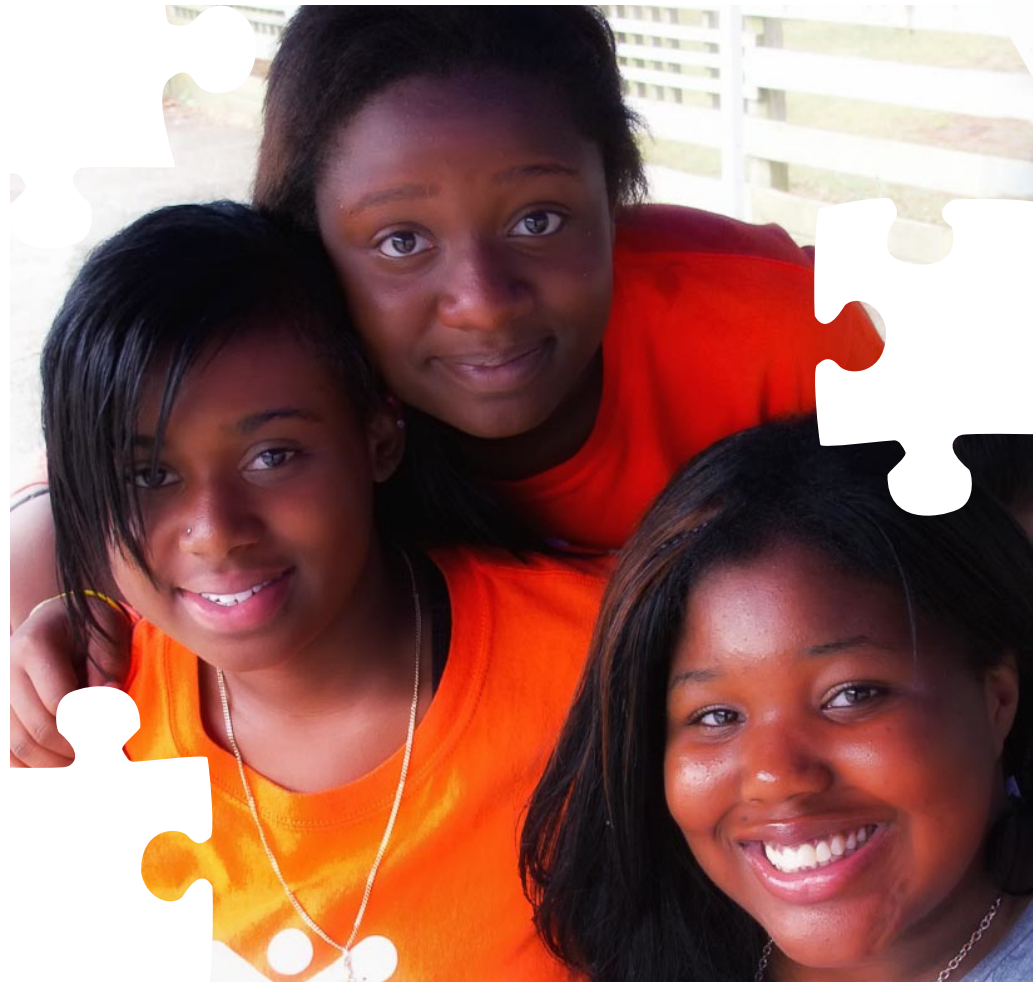

TREASURER'S REPORT

It is a pleasure to present this report on behalf of the 2011 Finance Committee. This was a year of great excitement as we witnessed the near completion of the 101 Spruce Street redevelopment project. There was a lot of effort to push the Capital Campaign in the minds of donors to raise funds for the project. This has been a great success and by year-end, the funds received for the project were over \$5.2million. There have been efforts to also make sure the Clubs have enough cash to cover the project expenses as they arise. In this regard we were very grateful that, The Kiwanis Club of Toronto through the TP Loblaw Charitable Trust advanced a bridging loan for \$800,000 and the Ontario Infrastructure and Lands Corporation was also approached to provide a credit facility of \$1,570,311 on the pledges made. There is still a great need to push harder and raise more funds for the completion of this inspiring project. It has also been a phenomenal year with the reopening of the 101 Spruce Street location that enables more children from the Regent Park community to be served at this state of the art facility. The refurbished location has a number of new programs for the after school and youth programs. To make all these programs possible, the Clubs continued to rely on the generous support of donors and organizations such as the Ministry of Health Promotions, The Kiwanis Club of Toronto and the United Way of Toronto. In addition, a total of \$192,322 was raised from donations and fundraising activities. Events like



Blue Print continue to be important as a source of revenue towards the programs and there is a need to grow these.

I would like to thank Kathy Maney and Ian Edward who have provided so much support to the Finance committee, Bob Coffey, Eddie Staines and Patrick Hogan who have all joined to serve on the Finance Committee. Many thanks go to the board and committees members who are such an inspiration for their tireless efforts for the Clubs. Final gratitude to the staff, volunteers and financial supporters who make this important work possible for the benefit of the children and youth in Toronto.

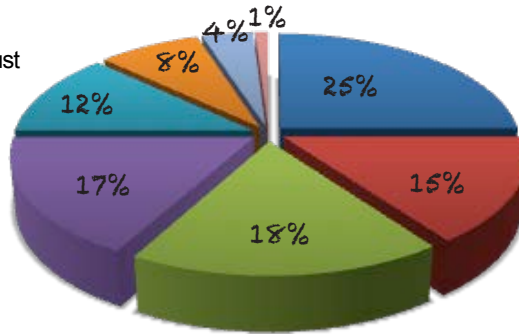

2011 REVENUE AND EXPENSE

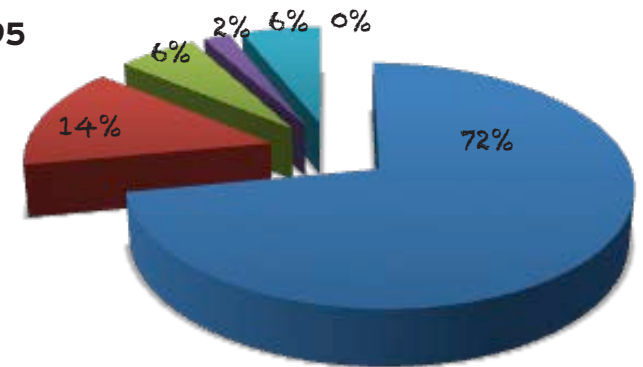

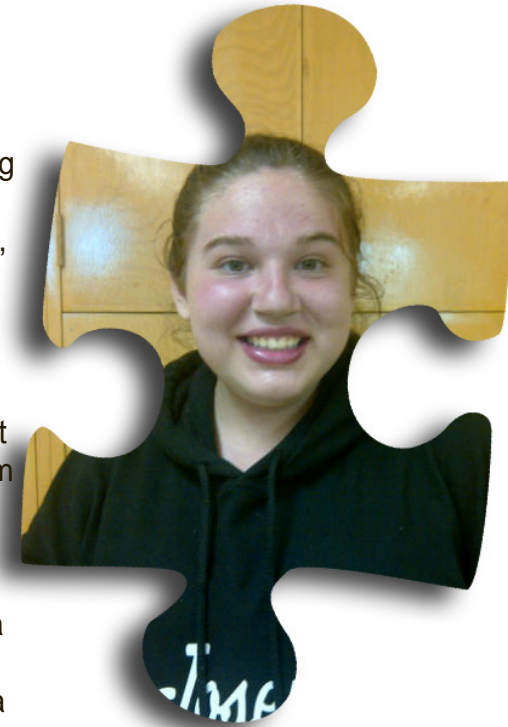
Volunteer of the Year: Kathy Foote

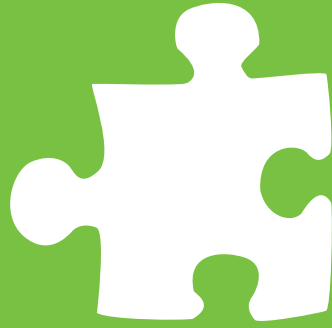
