PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Toronto Kiwanis Boys and Girls Clubs has been serving inner-city children and youth in Toronto for more than 80 years... but this past year feels like a new era!

Early in 2012, we opened our newly redeveloped Spruce Street Club after more than two years of construction. And although there is still some finishing touches to be completed both inside and out, I'm sure everyone who's been in the Club can feel the new energy and excitement.

We also introduced some terrific new programs for children, as well as an expanded youth program in the Miles and Kelly Nadal Youth Centre. These young people now have a dedicated space and earlier access - making it an ideal location to meet-up with friends, do homework, and learn new life-skills. We have also entered into some amazing new community service partnerships. An example is the partnership with UforChange, who are running youth arts based workshops at the Spruce Street Club that provide support and resources to youth so they can pursue higher education, volunteering, job shadowing and/or employment opportunities. We expanded our staff compliment, adding new positions in order to better service our two communities: Regent Park and Trinity-Bellwoods. These new positions also give more young people the work experience they need to kick-start a career. TKBGC is proud to be the largest employer of youth in the downtown east.

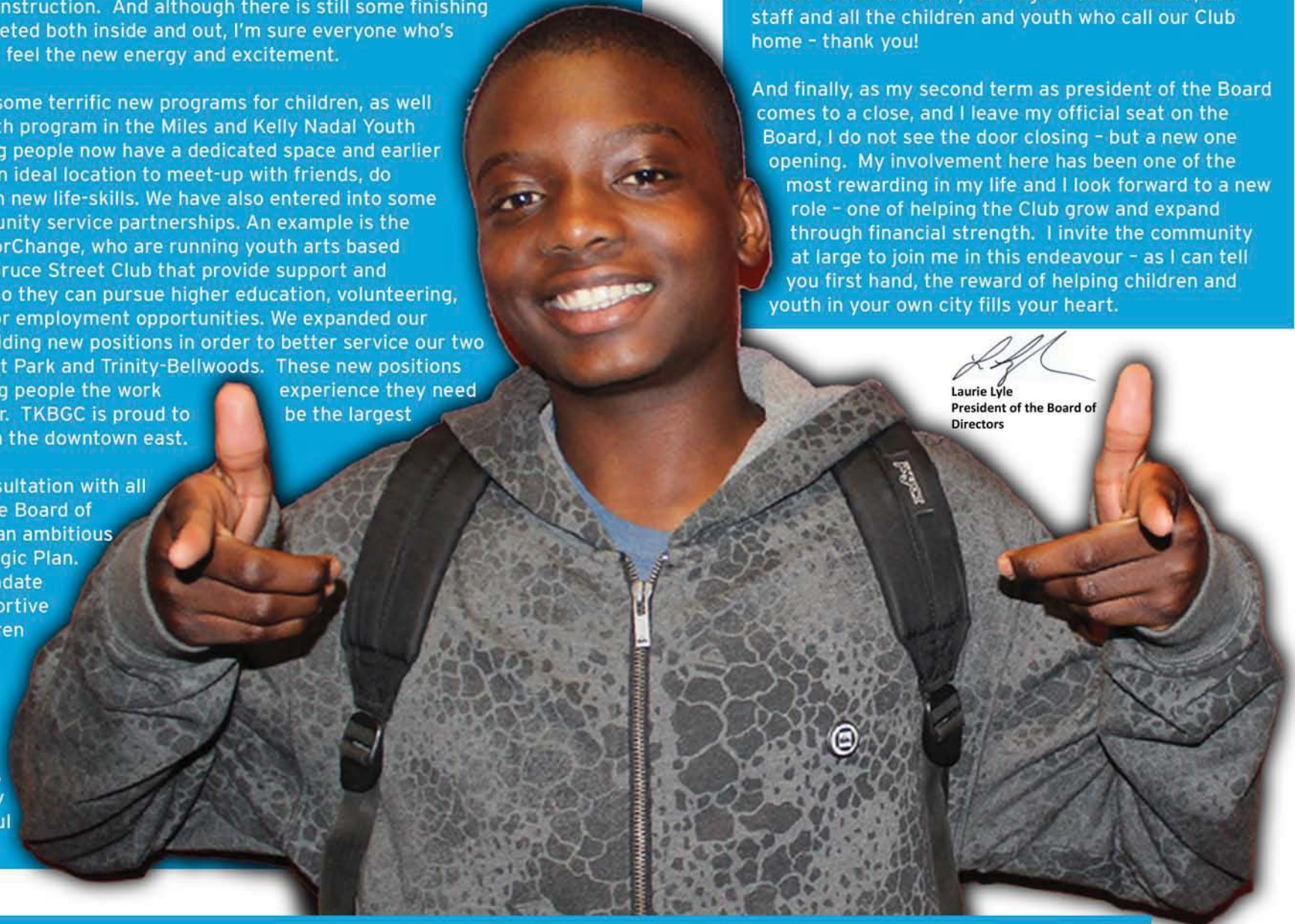
After extensive consultation with all our stakeholders, the Board of Directors approved an ambitious new five-year Strategic Plan. We adopted the mandate to be the safe, supportive hub where the children and youth of Regent Park, Cabbagetown, downtown east and Trinity Bellwoods can connect with mentors, each other, and their community to become successful in life.

I'm proud to say we've welcomed into our circle an impressive list of new volunteers, donors and sponsors this past year. The time and financial donations made to our Club allow us to achieve our goals and strive to be better. 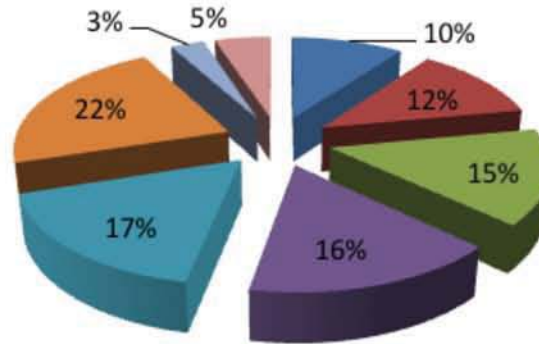


2012 REVENUE AND EXPENSES



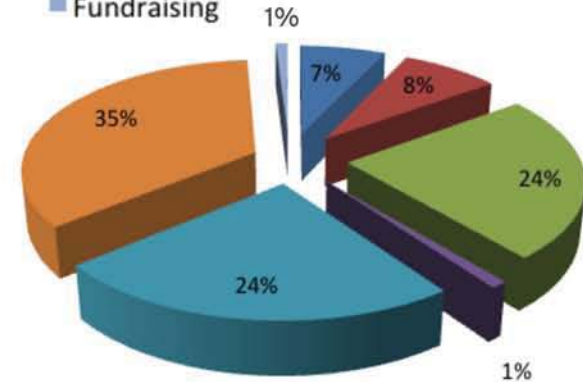

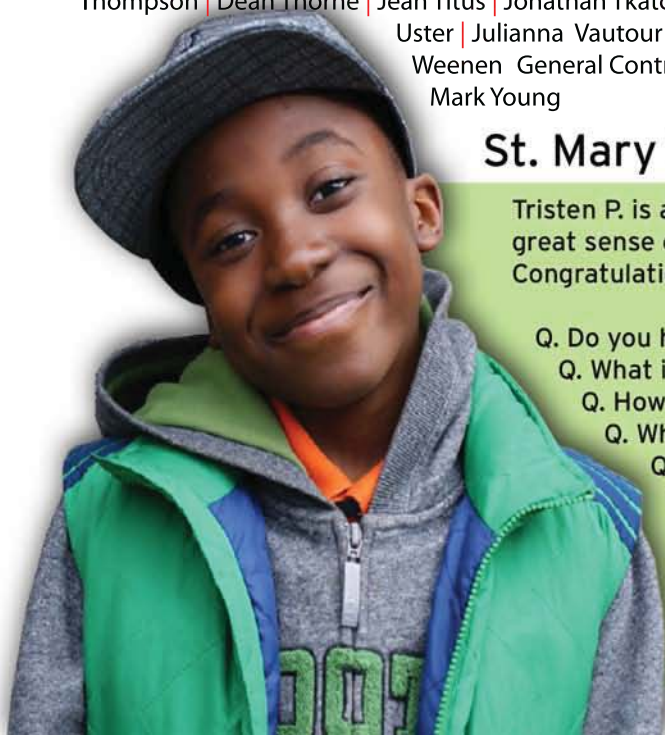

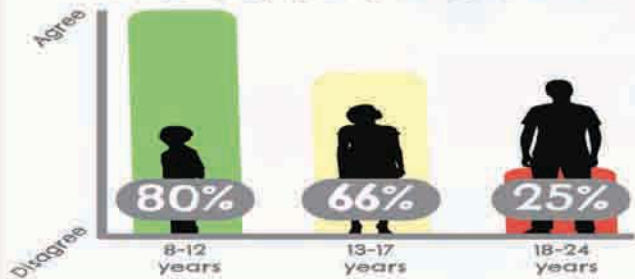

Boys and Girls Clubs of Canada is dedicated to supporting and encouraging children and youth as they grow and develop. We believe it is important to engage young people and listen carefully to their voices and ideas. We launched The World According to Us National Youth Survey to effectively listen to young people themselves about their hopes, dreams, ideas and needs.

3000 young people across Canada in three age cohorts – 8-12, 13-17 and 18-24 – were asked their opinions on a range of topics: What makes you happy and confident? What issues are they concerned about? Can young people make a difference in the world? How can adults help young people be happy and successful now and in the future?

This survey is one of the most comprehensive of its kind ever conducted in Canada, and one of the first to gather the voices and opinions of young people aged 8-12. Boys and Girls Clubs also actively involved young people in all phases of the project – from survey design, to the analysis and release of the results.

A new platform for youth

Boys and Girls Clubs of Canada is engaged in action research about best practices in youth engagement in their clubs and launched The World According to Us, an on-line platform where Canadian youth can voice their thoughts, opinions, and creative solutions on issues that affect their lives. Are adults listening?

A recent UNICEF study found that Canada ranks 25th of 28 countries when it comes to relationships between teens and their family and friends.

The results from our survey show that, as young people grow up, they become less and less confident that their voices and concerns are being listened to, and heard, by adults. 80% of tweens (aged 8-12 years) agree that adults listen to them, while just 66% of teens (aged 13-17) and 25% of young adults (aged 18-24) agree that adults listen to their ideas, dreams and concerns.

The fact that young people feel less heard just as they are seeking to establish their identities and contribute their skills to their communities and to the world is of concern.

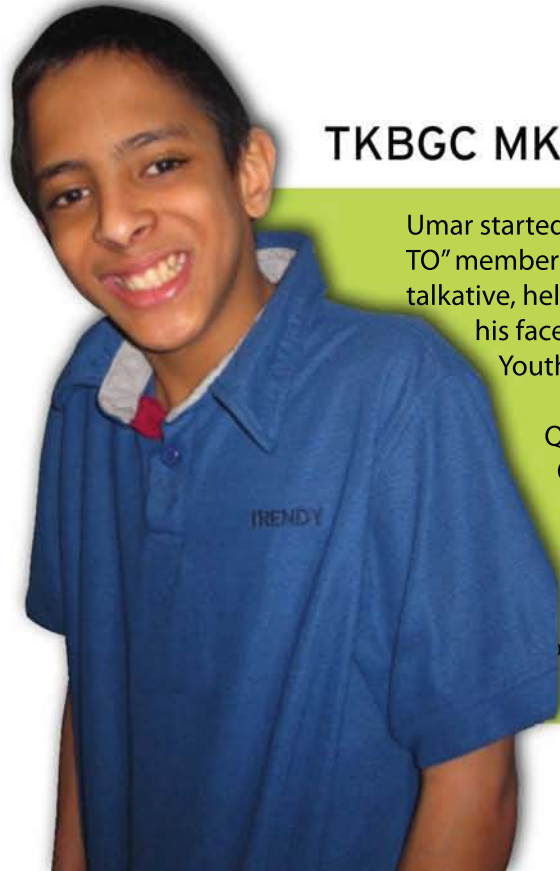
