**1917** Kiwanis Club of Toronto (KCT) meets all regulations and becomes Chartered Member of Kiwanis International

**1921** KCT sponsors first boys club house on Adelaide Street W.

**1932** Theodore Pringle Loblaw Trust is established. KCT uses Trust to support the work of "Boys Clubs"

**1936** KCT opens the Gerrard K Club-in the basement of the church at 101 Spruce Street

**1939** KCT purchases facility at 101 Spruce Street

**1945** The Royal Norwegian Air Force donates land in Huntsville, ON, KCT to operate Camp Kiwanis. (formerly Camp "Vesle Skaugum")

**1984** The George Rigg Kiwanis Scholarship is established in honour of Club Director George Rigg.

**1988** Gerrard K Club undergoes first renovation

**2000** Mitown K Club is renamed to honour the Kiwanis Club of Toronto - T.P Loblaw Trust.

**2001** The award winning Community Safe Walk Program begins to address community safety needs

**2003** The Toronto Kiwanis Boys and Girls Clubs becomes a full United Way Member Agency

**2007** TP Loblaw Club site is moved from Clarendon Street to St. Mary Catholic School allowing the club to serve more members!

**2010** The Club undertakes a \$7,000,000 Capital Campaign to renovate the 101 Spruce Street Location

**2011** We are the 7th Club in Canada to undergo a peer reviewed to ensure quality standards are met - WE PASSED!

**2012** Grand Re-opening of 101 Spruce Site with renewed commitment to serving the youth in the Regent Park Community through the Miles & Kelly Nadal Youth Centre

**2012** Salesforce provides the first Canadian Healthy Communities Grant to support expanded youth program

**2013** Sights set on increasing Highschool completion rates with the help of Rogers Raising the Grade Program

**2013** The Club awards the largest post-secondary scholarships in its history with the support of MHS and The W. Garfield Weston Foundation

**2013** Pepsico Canada Foundation invests in our Leaders In Training program and provides summer experiential learning for our youth

do more than simply curb threats, we offer safe program sites that provide children and youth with an opportunity to access quality assured programs, scholarships, bursaries, leadership and employment opportunities.

Our after-school programs follow the "Child and Youth Health and Wellness After-School Strategy" and guidelines set out by the Ontario Government's Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Sport that breaks down activities into:

- 30% physical activity
- 20% healthy eating and nutrition education
- 20% wellness and personal health
- 30% what makes us a Boys & Girls Club

Acting like a grassroots organization, we take direction from the bottom and allow the needs of the children, youth, families and communities we serve to guide the programs and services offered at each program site.

We are the **largest employer of youth in the downtown east** and have a **part-time staff count that consists of more than 60 young people annually.** For many young people, we provide them with their first real job.

What makes us unique is our continuum of service supporting young people at all ages and stages to reach their individual potential.

Capital Depreciation and the Amortization of Capital Contributions represent the expenses and donations associated with the redevelopment of our 101 Spruce St. facility and have been amortized over the life of the lease. At December 31 2016 the shortfall in revenue specific to the redevelopment equaled \$274,510

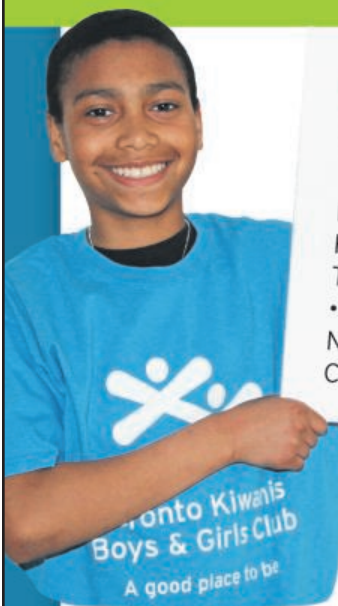
